# Operation Christmas Child



As Pres-Bees, we like to participate in service projects which will help others. We will be joining members of the congregation in "Operation Christmas Child". The project entails filling wrapped shoe boxes with small gift items to be given to children around the world to help them celebrate Christmas (see article below). At Pres-Bees, we want the children to actively participate so we are doing things a bit differently. There will be collection boxes on the stage. One is for shoe boxes which the Pres-Bees kids will wrap. The other is for the items to fill the shoeboxes. You can refer to the list of suggested items below and/or get creative. On November 18, the kids will wrap the shoe boxes and fill them with the donated items and label them for the appropriate age and gender of the child for which it is intended. You can donate individual items such as a toothbrush or Slinky® or a multi-pack of something like batteries, lollipops, or socks. We think the kids will have a lot of fun filling the boxes! All donated items need to be at Pres-Bees by November 18 so we can get them to the congregational coordinator for adequate shipping time.

The *Board of Deacons* has decided it would like our church to participate in "Operation Christmas Child," sponsored by Samaritan's Purse. This is a nondenominational program designed to give Christian children in distressed areas around the world a little bit of Christmas. We would like all age groups to be represented in this project. If you are not familiar with this program, there will be brochures at church in the next few weeks that should answer your questions. The basic idea is to purchase small items that would appeal to children ages 2 - 14. These items will be used to fill shoeboxes, one per child. The brochures give a list of suggested items, and other helpful information. The pick-up dates for the boxes are November 16 - 23, so it isn't too early to start shopping!

## Gift Suggestions

School Supplies - pens, pencils and sharpener, crayons or markers, stamps and ink pad sets, writing pads or paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc.

Toys - small cars, balls, dolls, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, small Etch A Sketch®, toys that light up or make noise (with extra batteries), Slinky®, etc.

Hygiene Items - toothbrush, toothpaste, mild bar soap (in a plastic bag), comb, washcloth, etc.

Other - hard candy and lollipops, mints, gum (please place all candy in ziploc bag), T-shirts, socks, ball caps, sunglasses, hair clips, toy jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries)

A Personal Note - You may enclose a note to the child and a photo of yourself or your family. (If you include your name and address, the child may write back.)

**DO NOT INCLUDE:** Used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; chocolate or food; out of date candy; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans
