RECYCLING NOTES

As recently reported by the Recycling Interest Group, Styrofoam is a serious threat to wildlife, the environment, and personal health. Here are a few reminders concerning its negative impact on our society.

- Styrofoam is the main pollutant in oceans, bays, and other United States water sources. It causes choking and starvation in wildlife.
- It is composed of Benzene and Styrene, both of which are known carcinogens, which have been, linked to Parkinson's disease and leukemia.
- Microwaving Styrofoam causes the release of toxic chemicals, which pose a threat to human health.

It is a primary source of urban litter and is the 5th largest source of hazardous waste in the United States.

In response to this critical information, the Session has approved a resolution that First Presbyterian Church will not use Styrofoam in the future due to its negative impact on human health, wildlife, and the environment. (Styrofoam currently in storage at the church may be used for the storage of cold food or for other non-food uses.)

Church members are encouraged to consider this serious information in their personal usage as well.

Nationwide Bell-Ringing Celebration of 150th Anniversary of the end of American Civil War

The Salem Historical Society is supporting a nationwide bell-ringing celebration marking the 150th anniversary of the symbolic end of the American Civil War. After four years of fighting and the loss of thousands of brave men and women, the end was in sight as General Grant accepted General Lee's surrender at Appomattox Court House, Virginia. Salem's diarist Daniel Howell Hise wrote of a "great day of rejoicing in Salem" when it was evident in April 1865 that the fighting had ceased.

On April 9, 2015, bells will be rung at 3:00 p.m. at Appomattox. As was reported in last week's SALEM NEWS and MORNING JOURNAL, local communities are encouraged to ring bells or church chimes beginning at 3:15 p.m. and lasting for four minutes, one minute for each year of the war.

Only five days after the "great rejoicing," April 14 was reported "a SAD DAY" on the announcement that Abraham Lincoln had been assassinated. In commemoration of this "sad day," the Salem Historical Society will drape the columns of the Dale Shaffer Library in black.
