## More Than Just Recycling!

It has been so exciting to see the increased interest our congregation has shown in recycling over the past 2 years. But, as I explained earlier this month at Denise's Big Backyard, the recycling symbol is made up of 3 arrows that tell us to **Reduce**, **Reuse**, and **Recycle**. We are doing great with the Recycling, but I would like to encourage our church families to consider working harder on Reducing, and Reusing.

Every year, Americans throw away 50 billion food and drink cans, 27 billion glass bottles and jars, and 65 million plastic and metal jar and can covers. More than 30% of our waste is packaging materials. Where does it all go? Some 85% of our garbage is sent to a dump, or landfill, where it can take from 100 to 400 years for things like cloth and aluminum to decompose. Glass has been found in perfect condition after 4,000 years in the earth!

We are quickly running out of space. It's time to remember the three R's of the environment: **Reduce, Reuse, Recycle**. Then practice what you preach: don't buy things you don't need or items that come in wasteful packaging or that cannot be recycled. **Reuse and recycle whatever you can.** 

With a little more thought, we can all change our habits so that each one of us throws out less garbage. These small, but worthwhile changes may at first seem inconvenient, but soon they will become second nature.
