Dear Friends,

What can we say about this deep-freeze we've been in? Even those who love winter are getting tired of shoveling, arctic air, bad roads, and "snow days." Perhaps the worst effect of this kind of weather is how isolating it can be, as we choose not to venture out unless absolutely necessary. This is a good time to check in with others by whatever technology we have at our disposal. Winter will be half-way over on February 2; come hear about why that's important!

Since we are still in the first month of the year, this is also a time to say a word about this line item in the church budget known as per capita. Per capita is an assessment (not a "tax") that is based on the number of active members in each congregation. Each Presbytery collects per capita from each of its congregations, and then sends a portion on to the Synod and to the General Assembly. For Eastminster Presbytery in 2014, the total assessment is \$32, of which \$21.73 is retained by the Presbytery, \$3.25 goes to the Synod of the Covenant, and \$7.02 goes to General Assembly. You can watch a video (made several years ago) on what per capita is used for by going to the Eastminster Presbytery site at <a href="https://www.eastminsterpresbytery.org">www.eastminsterpresbytery.org</a> and clicking on a link on the right side of the home page. There we learn that per capita supports the "infrastructure" of the Presbytery – building expenses, some staff salaries, office supplies, and other normal operating expenses. Like the church depicted in the video, we too encourage our members to make a special gift to cover per capita expenses each year as a way of affirming that we are a connectional Church that appreciates the help and support we receive from the larger Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).

Speaking of Eastminster Presbytery, the Rev. Graham Standish, from whom I've taken several continuing education courses, will be presenting a workshop on "Encountering, Experiencing, and Embracing the Holy in Worship" on February 8 at the First Presbyterian Church of Mineral Ridge. I, along with a couple members of our Worship Committee, are planning to attend this Presbytery-sponsored event which runs from 10 a.m. – 4 p.m. The event is <u>free</u> and you are invited to join us; we are asked to make reservations for lunch (also free of charge!) by January 31.
