Dear Friends,

On March 18, we received the following message from Presbyterian Disaster Assistance:

Earthquake. Tsunami. Nuclear meltdown. Any one of these disasters could be catastrophic. Rescue efforts continue in Japan following the March 11 tsunami and earthquake and the growing nuclear crisis. Thousands have been confirmed dead, tens of thousands are missing, and hundreds of thousands have been evacuated. The Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) is responding through Presbyterian Disaster Assistance and our ecumenical and mission partners. Already, \$100,000 from the *One Great Hour of Sharing* offering has been sent to provide emergency relief to this devastated nation, where Presbyterians have been engaged in active mission work since 1859.

There are two different though related ways by which we can contribute to these relief efforts:

- One is to contribute to the *One Great Hour of Sharing*, which we are collecting right now. 32 cents of every dollar given to the *One Great Hour of Sharing* goes to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance precisely so that quick and effective responses may be made whenever disaster strikes. (The rest of the receipts are divided between the Presbyterian Hunger Program and the Self-Development of People program.)
- The second way to help is through gifts designated *specifically* for assistance to Japan. Presbyterian Disaster Assistance has created a special fund to receive all gifts that are so designated.

Thank you for your continued generosity to people in need, both here in Salem and around God's world.

## More of our Church History ...

From the Messenger, March 18, 1951:

### ONE GREAT TIME FOR SHARING

Sunday, March 11, was designated as the time for the offering for "One Great Time for Sharing". The needs of today are greater than before, particularly in Korea, where the ravages of war might well leave a question of the whereabouts of Christ's followers in the minds of the suffering ones. It is easy for us to unintentionally let such suffering and dire need slip our minds, for we are not faced with starvation or loss of our children, or homeless, or lonely. Because we have so very much for which to be thankful, we are all the more obligated to share with those who have so little.

Only 160 envelopes were returned for the offering last Sunday morning. Over 600 were distributed. Let us prayerfully and conscientiously endeavor to return more nearly 100% this next week for this vital project for relief of our neighbors in need. As Paul Calvin Payne has said, "We cannot callously turn and pass by on the other side like the priest and Levite in the parable of the good Samaritan, without putting ourselves in their contemptible category. On the other hand, a swift, generous response to human suffering by a great nation would kindle a flame of hope in this dark world that would go far to reestablish humanity's vanishing faith in decency and goodness and truth."

From the Messenger, March 30, 1941:

### Fifth Anniversary — Organized in 1936 THE WOMEN'S ASSOCIATION

We are justifiably proud of the Women's Association of our Church. When the Pastor came to Salem, the Ladies' Aid Society had charge of social activities. In taking over the work of this historic organization, the Association did not supplant the Ladies' Aid Society, but sought rather to extend its scope and increase its usefulness to our Church and the Kingdom of God. So that in a very real sense, the Aid is perpetuated in the present Women's Association. The Aid included only a small proportion of the women, whereas the present Association includes all the women of the church. New women joining the Church, automatically become members of the Association, and are enlisted in its helpful program. Five outstanding women have served as Presidents of this Association — Mrs. Hannah R. Maule, Mrs. George W. Bunn, Mrs. J.W. Astry, Mrs. Stanton Heck, and Mrs. Don C. Carey. The Association inspired us all in 1939 by pledging \$10,000 to the Building Fund of our New Church. On the 5th anniversary, they report having raised for the Building Fund during this past year, the remarkable sum of nearly \$3,000. Could there be any finer proof of their splendid cooperation, earnestness, sacrifice and hard work? Long live the Women's Association! — Rev. Raymond David Walter, Minister
