

Recycling Reminders for the Holidays

- When entertaining, try to limit the use of throw away plates and cups. Pull out those pretty plates and glasses that many of us have sitting in our cupboards that are begging to be used!
- Lightly soiled paper plates can be recycled as well as plastic cups if they have a recycle number on them.
- Please, please, please, don't use Styrofoam! Pass the word on to your families and friends about the health hazards and environmental concerns.
- Foil pans and lightly soiled foil can be recycled just rinse them off before recycling.
- When wrapping your gifts, use paper wrapping paper that can be recycled. Avoid using foil type papers. These cannot be recycled.
- Gift bags can be used many times! Please save these from going into the trash. The tissue paper that is used in these bags can be recycled or better yet reused.
- I recently saw large sized reusable shopping bags at TJ Max with Christmas designs on them for only 99 cents. These would be great used as gift bags.
- Gift boxes can be reused or recycled.
- Remember packing peanuts and other packing materials can be taken to UPS stores to be used again.
- If you still use a live tree for your Christmas tree, remember to recycle it.
- When doing your grocery shopping, please remember to put your reusable grocery bags in the car and THEN take them into the store.
- Pass your Christmas cards on to a teacher after the holiday.
- Remember to take all the plastic bags from your Christmas shopping, dry cleaning, etc., to Giant Eagle for recycling.

Cut Out Party"?

This year at Pres-Bees, we are using a new curriculum that uses the old teaching method of telling Bible stories with flannel board. Our flannel board kit includes almost 600 flannel figures and objects to be used in telling almost 200 Bible stories. I thought that it would be no problem to cut



out the necessary items each week, but I am finding that to be very time-consuming. The items to be cut out are found on numerous sheets of flannel and the images for each story are not grouped together. This means that not only must I cut out each figure, but that first I have to locate it, which is much harder than it sounds! The curriculum DOES include a storage system which makes the numbered items easy to find after they've been cut out. I could definitely use some help in cutting out these items, so that they could be stored and easily located from then on. If anyone would like to have a "cut out party," or, if some of you would be willing to take a sheet or two of flannel home and cut out the items printed on it, that would be a tremendous help. Otherwise this is going to take me several hours each week that could be better spent on more urgent needs. The kids really seem to love having the stories told with flannel board, so I don't want to abandon this teaching method. If you'd like to contribute to the Christian Education of our children, but aren't sure what you can do, this might be a great project for you! Please call the Church Office if you can help.
